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Students are introduced to the fundamentals of interior design, carefully integrated with an introduction to interior design principles, construction and presentation techniques all set in the context of the design process as a whole. an inspirational exploration of the development of style in the world of interiors and the decorative arts, to the history of interiors and architecture. All these areas are further developed as the course progresses so that students can develop their design solutions and effectively communicate their ideas. Lighting design, Fabrics and colors are key topics while other very relevant contemporary issues such as environmentally friendly design and housing technology are similarly highlighted. Design trends and the elements that go into creating decorative schemes as an integral part of a design, also form a valuable part of the course, together with the application and specification of materials and finishes.
