The project is providing a ground-breaking way for young people to engage in intercultural learning. Working with Youth Organisations and Universities, the project is open to **any young person aged 18-30 residing in Europe and the Southern Mediterranean**. During its first pilot year in 2018, the project has engaged more than 8.200 participants from 42 European and Southern Mediterranean countries.
